The W & B Community Minibus

This is a joint initiative between Burham & Wouldham Parish Councils working in partnership with Compaid to operate as a not-for-profit community transport scheme. A brand new 15-seater minibus was leased with funding from Kent County Council. Residents of the two parishes, including Peters Village, can apply for membership to use the Community Minibus.

Weekly Shopper Bus

Compaid runs a regular weekly shop and ride service for residents who still like the independence of doing their own shopping or going for coffee/lunch in a local Medway town. The shopper minibus is driven by a Compaid driver and provides a local pick-up service to a local supermarket with a café as well as central drop off points in local towns. This service is available on the following days: Monday to Strood # Tuesday to Hempstead # Wednesday to Chatham # Thursday to Strood. The charge for this is £10 flat rate for a return trip and must be booked in advance and you must be a member of the Scheme.

Day Trips for Residents

In the months ahead, it is hoped the minibus will be available with a trained driver for community trips and outings to places of interest outside the village such as historic venues, garden centres, markets, events and the seaside. We need volunteer drivers and we always welcome new recruits! Keep an eye on the noticeboards and website for details.

How to join the scheme

Passengers must be registered as a member of the Community Bus Scheme. If you wish to become a member the annual cost is $\pounds 10$ per person or $\pounds 20$ per family. Please contact the Parish Clerk for a membership application form.

Car Parks

This will necessitate the closure of the car parks whilst the work is being carried out. We hope the car parks will only be closed for a short period of time. Notices will be placed on cars etc. once we have full details.

War Memorial

Crack in cross repair: A decision from the War Memorial Trust has been deferred pending further information from the contractors, with a deadline of end of February. Previous contractors contacted for further information. This has now been submitted to the War Memorial Trust and hopefully we should hear back from them early May.

Litter Pick

A village litter pick will be organized in due course, once Spring has finally sprung!!

Council Tax

Residents will have received their Council Tax bills by now. This bill covers the tax due to KCC, KCC Adult Social Care, TMBC, Burham Parish Precepts, Kent & Medway Fire Authority and Kent Police including the Police and Crime Commissioner. Council Taxpayers can pay in 12 monthly instalments, if they wish, instead of the normal 10 monthly payments by emailing: revenues@tmbc.gov.uk. This must be done by 31st March 2024 to take effect in the coming financial year. Anything coming after that will apply for the following financial year. Once the request is made it will roll over to subsequent years automatically.

CPR Training

From the Police

Our team has expanded which means PC Georgia Marshall now has less areas and can devote more of her time to Burham. Hopefully the residents will see her around more often from now on.

Tracey Crouch MP

As you will be aware, Tracey will not be seeking re-election for Chatham and Aylesford. She has been an exceptional champion for our community and had a national reputation through her work on loneliness, fixed odds betting terminals, cancer and her Independent Review into Football Governance. We have always found her willing to help or give advice on ward matters and casework and she will be greatly missed by many of our residents.

From the Kent County Councillor In early summer the new "Community Bridge" website will be launched, featuring information on almost 200 local groups and societies. This has been arranged/organized via C/Cllr Andrew Kennedy. Groups can be searched by village, by activity or by postcode and the site will not only provide full details of each group, but where and when they meet, how much they cost and who to contact for more information. There will also be a print version for those who don't have digital access. The whole project will be funded through grants and donations and Andrew hopes it will be a very helpful resource to bring people together and promoting our community.

From KCC Highways

Scarborough Terrace speeding: KCC highways have confirmed that they would support enhancements of the 30mph speed limit terminals, by installing a "30" roundel road marking, edge of carriageway lining either side to create visual narrowing, installation of a Glasdon village gateway and replacement of the existing speed limit terminal signs. This would require a full design which would be shared with the Parish Council but before they proceed. they have requested to explore funding opportunities with the parish council. A detailed quote will be provided as part of the design work, but the proposals could cost up to £4-5k. The Parish Council has offered a suggestion of 10% of the total project cost as the results were unknown, KCC have advised that given their limited budget, may not be able to commit to allocating the balance to the scheme at this time. We await further information. Church Street: KCC Highways will arrange and fund some road narrow signs with a 'no passing places' plate to be installed on the grass verge just before the entrance to the car park as well as the junction with New Court Rd. The 'road narrows' warning signs have been ordered, to be installed before 25 April 2024. KCC Highways do not propose to

make Church Street one way at this time as the ditches still allow two vehicles to pass, certainly when travelling towards New Court Rd, but will continue with the installation of the road narrow warning signs and continue to monitor the situation. We await the installation of the signage. New Court Rd Speeding/accidents: This has been added to the KCC Highway Improvement Plan for comments from KCC. Data surveys were carried out in three locations early 2024. Further data was provided by KCC Highways and although we respect the data results. we still have high concerns about the number of vehicles travelling at over 60mph. More accidents will occur unless some form of speed control is installed. KCC Highways have been advised of our concerns. KCC will discuss the location with their contacts at Kent Police to see what their thoughts are on the

matter. Also KCC could ask about the possibility of installing 40 roundels on the carriageway to complement the existing repeater signs. We await further information.

The Church in Burham - sad end of an era



It is with deep sadness that the decision has been taken for The Church in Burham to close. The reason for this is that over recent years several of our members have either moved away or have died. Our congregation has therefore diminished together with our income. The result of this is that we are no longer financially viable.

The process for closure will take a few months and until that time services and our other activities will continue. Once this process is complete, the building will be sold. There has been a Methodist Church in Burham since 1847. A group of Christians met originally in their homes before, with the generosity of the Knott family, land was donated and money raised to build, first the Church and later the rooms at the rear.

Sunday services will continue to be held at 10.30am each week, with a quarterly Ecumenical service with All Saints' Church Wouldham. We will continue to hold our Country Lunch on the third Thursday of each month at 1pm and our Book Exchange on the first Saturday of each month at 10.30 am till 12noon.

We hope that you will continue to support us at this time. Information will be posted on Burham Face Book as the situation becomes clearer. This will be a sad loss to our village and your thoughts and prayers will be appreciated.

Burham Church of St Mary the Virgin - the old church



One thing that has been in existence at Burham since the Domesday survey of England in 1086 is the 'Old Church'. The core of the nave was built in the 11th century; its fabric consists of spoil recyled from even earlier times, including debris from Roman buildings. Other material used in its construction includes tufa, a type of rough ragstone, firestone, Kentish rag, dressed ashlar and flint. North and south aisles were added in the late 12th or early 13th centuries, but were removed at a later date. At some time during the 14th century the chancel was enlarged, but was then restored to its original size, probably in the 16th century, when the nave aisles were demolished.

The present porch, a later addition, was built using the spoil from the demolished south aisle. The windows-now blocked, in the north and south walls are Norman in style. The low square tower at the west end of the nave was added during the 15th century.

Early wills give an indication of the appearance of the interior. That of John Philpott, 1498, mentions the stairs to the rood loft. The rood screen would have separated the

chancel from the nave. The stairs and the rood loft are no longer in existence; rood lofts were removed from churches during The Reformation. Wills of 1511 and 1516 mention gifts for painting the rood loft and several references to the light 'before the great rood' are also to be found. In addition to the light to Our Lady, which probably hung over the high altar, many other lights are also mentioned. These include those dedicated to the saints George, Nicholas, Christopher, Michael, Stephen, Lawrence, James and to the Holy Trinity. The light dedicated to St Christopher was most likely hung near to the south door. The crucifix light mentioned in the will of Robert Frere in 1511 would have hung before the great rood loft, over the entrance to the chancel. In the late 18th century, Edward Hasted describes the church as having some good painted glass in the windows.

Three bells formerly hung in the church. The middle one was the oldest known bell in the Diocese. It was made by Richard de Wymbis c1300. In 1516 Thomas a Dene left 6 shillings 8d for the treble bell to be changed to a tenor within 12 years. The treble, dated 1700, is the ear-

liest known bell made by Richard Phelps of Whitechapel. The other, which dates from 1734, was also made by Phelps and is one of his latest.

The Church Registers date back to the 1600s. The earliest recorded baptism is that of Francis Day, daughter of Richard Day the younger and his wife Joan, on 6 May 1627. Notes in the Registers give interesting information about the people living here. For instance one note states that Henry Poore of Burham was chosen by the parishioners to be the Registrar of the Parish on 19 December 1653. An odd entry records the burial of a dwarf, Jane Chamber's, on 24 February 1693.

The records show that between 1653 and 1699 money was allowed, presumably from the poor relief funds, for a wooden leg for Katherine Linney, and also paid to Walter for thatching the Parish House. The oldest legible memorial inscription in the churchyard, recorded in my audit in 2000, was that erected in memory of George, the son of George and Eliza (Elizabeth) Peckham of this parish, who died 20 March 1700.

One of the curiosities of the old churchyard was a memorial stone, now lost, dedicated to the Burham Belle. It bore a carving of a twisted face and the words: "Behold Burham's Belle, a delight/With her curls asymmetric and tight;/Let us hope that her Biz/Was as straight as her Phiz/And she kept, like her nose, to the right."

It is not known who she was, but the phrasing is considered to place the stone in the 19th Century. She may have been a local character, or possibly a woman found drowned.

By the 1920s the church was no longer used for regular worship and its fittings had been removed, with the exception of the font. A new larger church had been built in 1881, and the old one was used mainly as a mortuary chapel. Gradually the old church deteriorated, until the intervention of the Friends of Friendless Churches and the Kent Churches Preservation Trust. Extensive repairs were carried out, rescuing the building from virtual dereliction, which were completed by 1956, and the church was re-hallowed by the Lord Bishop of Rochester on 16 September of that year. The parish could not afford the maintenance of two churches. Therefore the old church became vested in the Redundant Churches Fund for preservation on 22 June 1973, and the Fund has since carried out necessary major repairs.
